

ALUV is, therefore, currently laying the groundwork to secure future funding for a community center. State funding is one element of this strategy.

ALUV will continue to work with Councilmember Debora Juarez, King County Councilmember Jeanne Kohl-Welles and members of both the 36th and 46th legislative districts to advance this goal. As we do, ALUV will be providing you with more information on the status of our effort.
