**III. Guest Speaker(s) - Jordan Haselnus, Project Coordinator with Seattle Neighborhood Group, Community Safety: funded through the City but non-profit status**

- Three Focus Areas
  - Crime Prevention Education Workshops
    - Usually underserved groups, immigrant communities; work with landlords - how to protect owner and tenant
  - Crime Prevention Environmental Design
    - Mary Amberg a good resource to come into neighborhoods and do inservice
      - Worked on Nesbitt between 88th and 90th Streets: lights, trimmed trees
    - Concerns about properties come up; will do an assessment for free
    - Can be a small or large project: park, school - actionable items
  - Hotspot organizing
    - Intersection, block or a place with negative behavior
    - 3-year project working with community to make it safer and more pleasant
      - Started one on Nesbitt
      - Will have community meeting about results - response from survey
      - Mid-January most likely and at Cascadia Elementary
      - Another example identified by community members: South Park - pedestrian bridge by elementary school - scary trail with needles, little lighting, shrubbery and yet kids need the trail to get to school.
        - Private property owners, parks, SDOT, WSDOT came together because no one would take ownership of the problem. Organization is bringing everyone together.
          - 5 new LED lights and trimmed trees
    - Nesbitt is a hotspot

    - Need a framework for giving feedback - discouraging when only one person attends
    - What do they need?
      - Don't have the same resources in the northend as in southend of the City
      - Maybe contact Michael Neguse as a guest speaker- can learn a lot from the southend
    - Helpful to get at-large council folks involved - they expressed how dangerous it was to walk Aurora during the tour
    - Approach the mayor's office and try and do a Find It, Fix It walk next year
      - Little understanding of our needs
    - Also need stories from young people - how are they affected?
  - Will sponsor candidate forums and outreach next year - maybe early June
    - Maybe with League of Women Voters
